

Then you'll tuck them inside a hollowed-out book with the microphone concealed by the dust cover, and you'll have a covert listening device that you can leave lying around or on a shelf near a surveillance target. Then you (or an undercover agent) in the next room can eavesdrop on any devious plotting through an ordinary FM radio.

Life-long maker and creator of the Bug-in-a-Book, David also develops and delivers original educational programs for science and technology venues through his company, Innovators Inc. (www.innovators-inc.net).. In 2010, he was named the Civil Air Patrol's New Jersey Aerospace Education Officer of the Year. He's delivered workshops for the Liberty Science Center, the Girl Scouts and the International Spy Museum. During the height of the COVID pandemic, David led numerous workshops for kids on the Outschool online platform including, "Hack Your Toys" and "Hack Your Bubble Blaster" earning dozens of glowing parent reviews. He created the Bug-in-a-Book project for the Spy Tech edition of Make Magazine. Then he turned it into a fun and easy electronics kit and workshop. The first Bug-in-a-Book workshop was held in 2011 at the International Spy Museum in Washington, DC (where else?) where Dave first met Bob Wallace (who else?).
