




community to draft a national intelligence estimate on the implications of climate change. In so doing, the president injected new urgency into an old question: What counts as a national security threat?

A CIA Legend Passes Away

Jack Downing, a renowned spymaster who became the only CIA officer to run and recruit agents in both Beijing and Moscow during the Cold War, then came out of retirement in 1997 to reinvigorate the agency's demoralized clandestine branch, died June 27 at his home in Portland, Ore. He was 80.

Mr. Downing was the consummate field agent, colleagues said, a Harvard graduate and Marine Corps veteran who served two tours in Vietnam, spoke fluent Chinese and Russian, and delighted in reciting Chinese poetry as well as developing new ways to evade the KGB. "He was everybody's idealized version of what a spy would be like," said Jonna Mendez, a former chief of disguise at the CIA.

Biology." Wickiser describes the growing influence of synthetic biology and what can happen if it gets in the wrong hands.

Artemus bioweapons expert, Randy Larsen offers these comments:

I agree with Dr. Wickiser's thesis ... with a couple comments.

- Most everything discussed in this episode was in our 2011 <u>WMD Center Report Card on Bio-Response</u>, but it sounds like more people, including Morell, now believe it.
- Regarding synthetic biology ... the "capabilities curve" of biotechnology is far steeper than Moore's Law. There is no question that high school students in the IGEM competition are today doing similar work (for under \$10,000) with what Nobel Laureates were doing in world-class labs a decade ago.
- However, in my opinion, the most likely bio-threat from a non-state actor is still a non-genetically engineered pathogen such as anthrax that uses undergraduate-level bio-technology to make it resistant to the two antibiotics in our Strategic National Stockpile—what the Soviets were doing in the early 1980s. Without effective treatment, inhalation anthrax will kill 80%+ of those infected.


